Reception Autumn 2 2022

Firstly, thank you for all your support at home with supporting your child to recognise letters and sounds and practise forming letters. The children have settled really well into routines and we've noticed lots of progress already.

Our project this half term is:



This interest-led project teaches children about the technology that is part of their daily lives and how machines help us. The project gives children the opportunity to build and create marvellous machines.

The children will continue to learn through a blend of child initiated play, teacher initiated learning and whole class lessons such as phonics and maths.

The vocabulary the children will learn include: Machine, communicate, technology, battery, electricity, sound, vibration, vehicle, wheel, axle, transport, robot, instructions, magnet, magnetic, material.

Reminders


Please ensure **every** item of clothing (including gloves and hats in the colder months) are labelled with your child's name. It makes it so much easier to return lost items!

PE for both Honeybees (Mrs Burrell) and Bumblebees (Mr Whiteley) will be every Monday. Children in Reception are expected to come to school in uniform and practice getting changed as independently as possible for PE sessions.

Forest School

Honeybees will venture into the wildlife area on Wednesday afternoons. **Bumblebees** will take part in Forest School every **Thursday** afternoon. If the weather is slightly rainy or cold, we still plan to learn outside, so please ensure your child is wearing suitable clothing. All-In-One puddle suits are perfect to go over school uniform and an extra warm layer. Only in extreme weathers will we cancel.

Phonics

The children are still working through Phase 2 of Little Wandle's Revised Letters and Sounds. After Christmas we will start teaching Phase 3. All children will read three times in school (a decoding, prosody and comprehension lesson) before taking the books home to read with families. A separate letter will be sent home about logging into eBooks next week. Once this is up and running, your child will not only be able to access their current reading book, but will be able to enjoy the books they have read previously over again. Keep an eye out for it! Thank you for writing in your child's reading record at least 3 times each week. The comments can relate to enjoying a Little Wandle book or a Read to Me book.
