Logging in to Developing Experts:

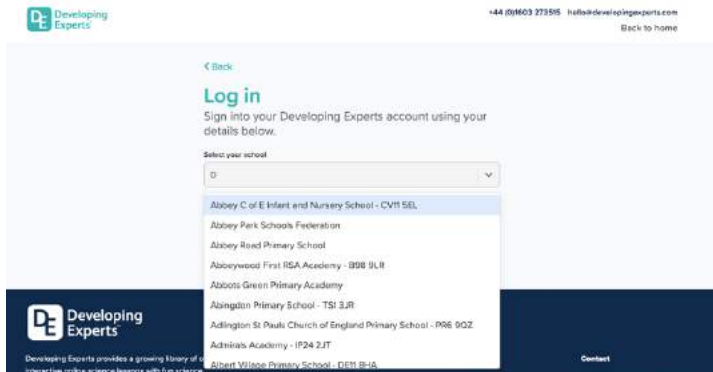

Click Log in, in the top right-hand corner and select the option, I'm a pupil.



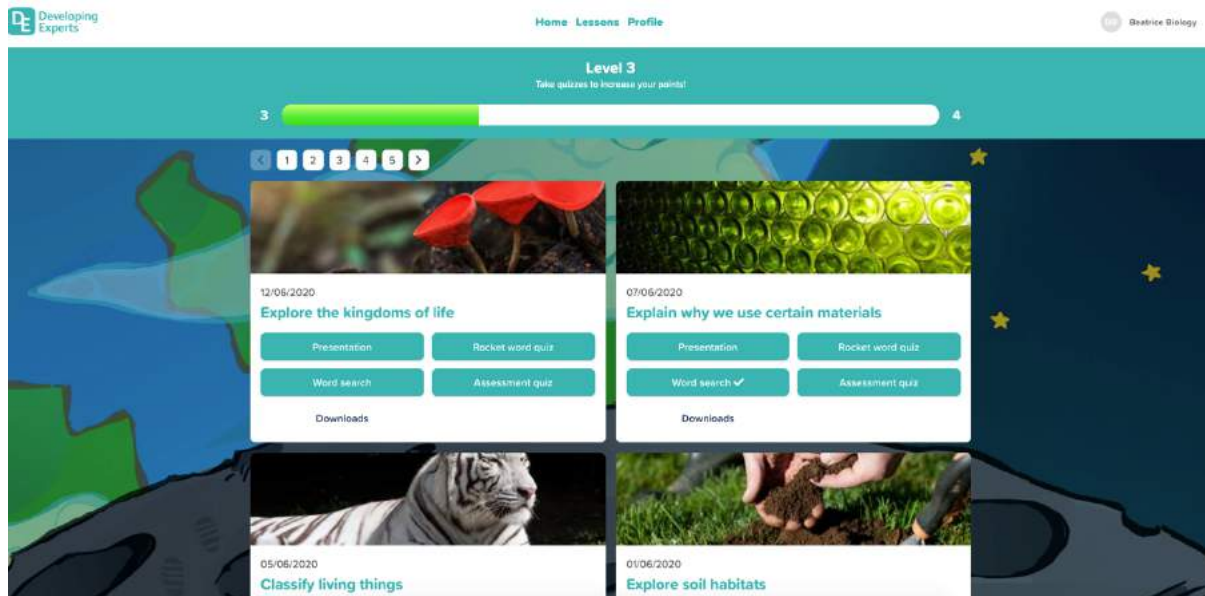
Type your school's name in the **Select your school** field – if your school has a common name (e.g. St Mary's), it may be easier to search the school by postcode. Then, enter the unique pupil code given to you by your school.



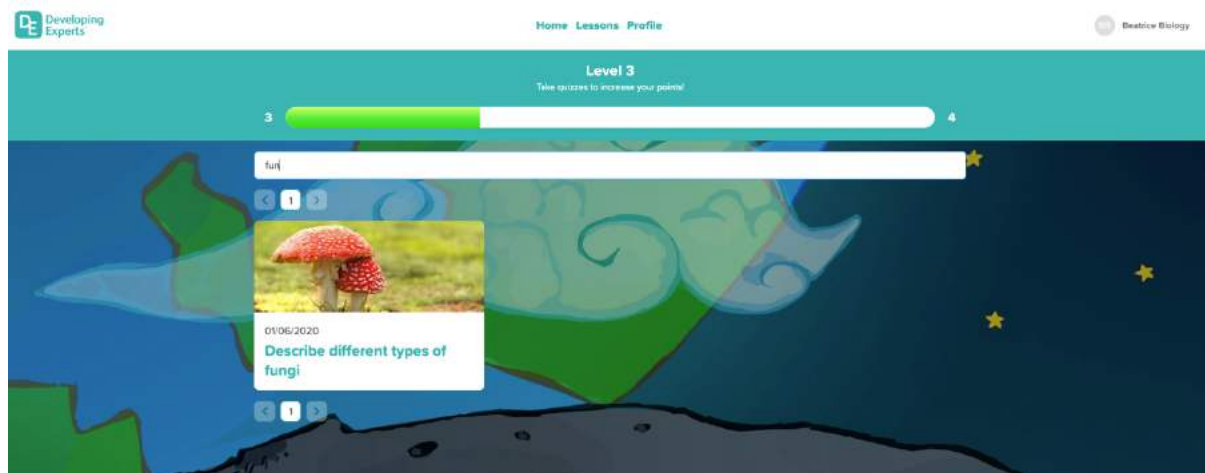


Pupil Dashboard

On the Homepage of the Pupil Dashboard, pupils can see the lessons assigned to them by their teacher. The most recent lessons will appear at the top of the page.



Pupils can search for a specific lessons by clicking on the **Lessons** tab and typing a word in the search bar.

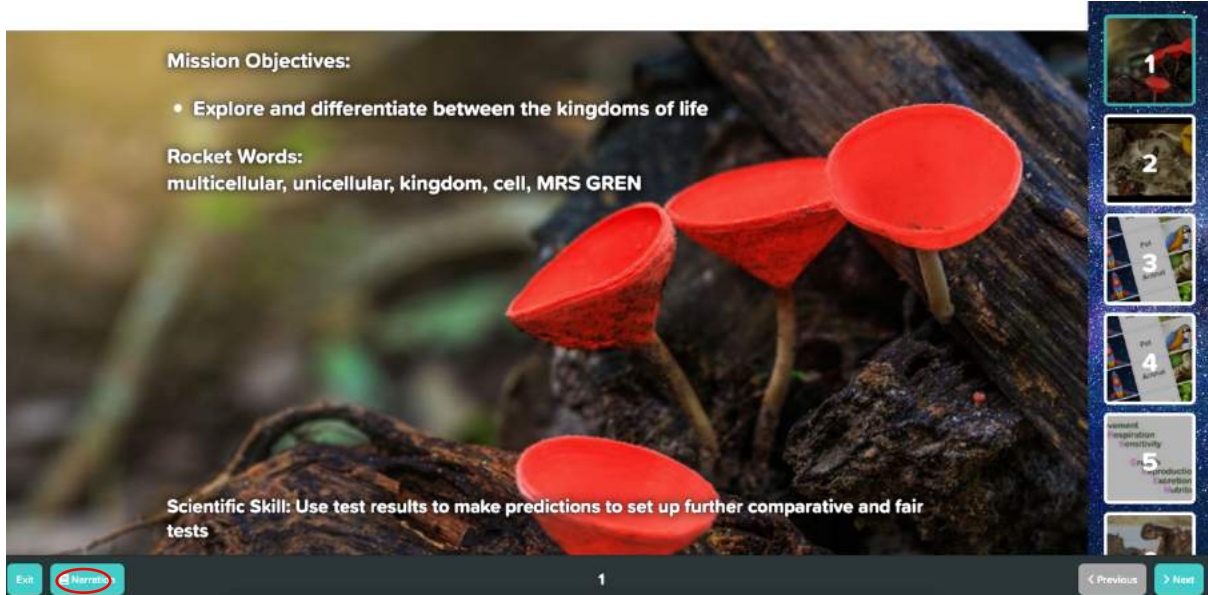


Pupils can access a variety of resources from a lesson through their dashboard. They are able to view the lesson's presentation, complete two quizzes and a word search. Also, they can download the PDF version of the lesson handout. A tick will appear when a task has been completed and pupils will earn points by completing quizzes to move up through the level! They can also explore career links and training pathway options, based on the experts they have heard from in the lessons.



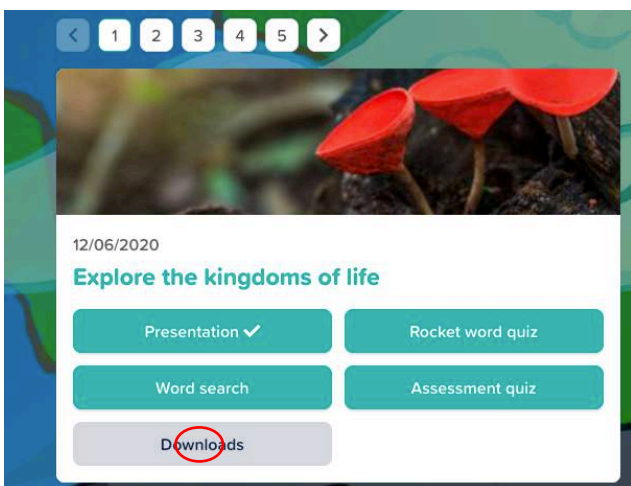
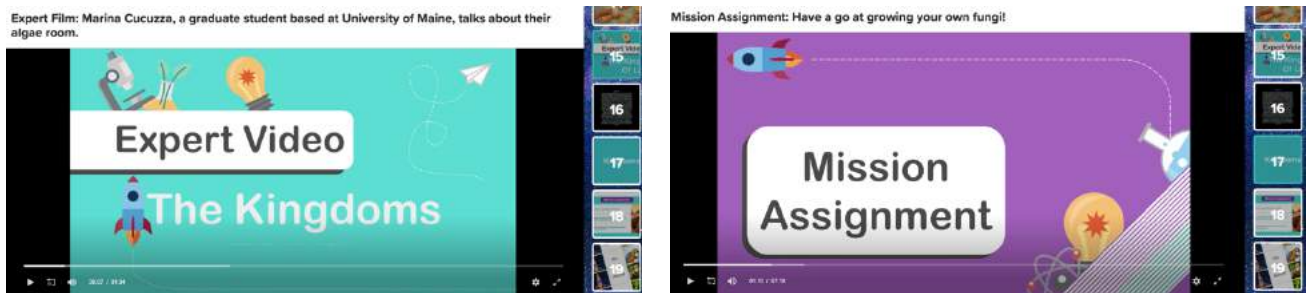
Presentation

The presentation tells the story of the key concepts covered in the lesson. To move through the slides of the presentation, either click Next, or use the slide scroller to select a specific slide.

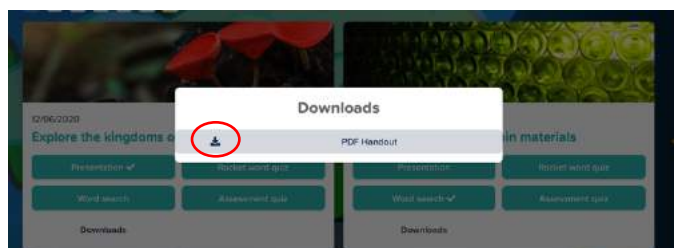


Click the Narration button to enable the slide to be read to the pupil.

Quizzes

There are 2 quizzes pupils can complete – the Rocket word quiz and the Assessment quiz.

The Rocket word quiz tests the pupil's knowledge on the 5 key words and their definitions explored in the lesson. These are multiple choice questions and pupils select the correct answer. If pupils select the wrong answer, they will be shown the slide from the presentation where they can find information to push them towards the correct answer.
