Our Safeguarding Team

At school we have five members of staff and a governor who make up our Safeguarding Leadership Team. Mr Peoples is our Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL); he is the lead person responsible for child protection and safeguarding issues. Mrs Hopkin, Mr Edwards and Mrs Crossley are our Deputy Designated Safeguarding Leads (Deputy DSLs); a deputy DSL supports the DSL in their role safeguarding and child protection. The role of the Safeguarding Governor is to support the DSL as well as regularly review, ask questions and make suggestions about our safeguarding policies and procedures and to report back to the governing body.

Drop Off and Collection

After advice from North Yorkshire County Council in the summer term, we decided to close the vehicle gates at drop off and collection. These gates were originally opened during the pandemic as a Covid-19 safety measure (to enable social distancing). Prior to that, the pedestrian gate had always been the only entrance and exit point.

It has been slightly congested at times and I have seen some pushchair users struggle with the step. I spoke to the Health and Safety executive at North Yorkshire Education Services, and they have reiterated the need to keep the vehicle gates closed and to avoid pedestrians being in an area where vehicles could be moving.

We have had some issues with delivery drivers who will move cones, open the gates and drive into the car park ignoring the flow of children and families. There have been several deliveries this week at these times where vans are moving during drop off and collection. With such a small car park, it is not possible to keep a safe distance.

In order to speed things up, I have requested that the step be made into a ramp to allow pushchairs and people with mobility issues to easily access the playground. This should speed things up and keep everyone moving.
