

Our Safeguarding Team

At school we have five members of staff and a governor who make up our Safeguarding Leadership Team. Mr Peoples is our Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL); he is the lead person responsible for child protection and safeguarding issues. Mrs Hopkin, Mr Edwards and Mrs Crossley are our Deputy Designated Safeguarding Leads (Deputy DSLs); a deputy DSL supports the DSL in their role safeguarding and child protection. Mrs Jo Burnside is our Safeguarding Link Governor. The role of the Safeguarding Governor is to support the DSL as well as regularly review, ask questions and make suggestions about our safeguarding policies and procedures and to report back to the governing body.

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about SHARING PHOTOS

School is often a time chock - full of milestones for your child, and you may well be eager to share their accomplishments with the world. In today & digital age, sharing images of such precious moments on social media is common place, and — while that is a lovely thing to do — it does come with some risks attrached. Our guide can help parents and carers to consider the potential dangers and make informed choices about safely sharing photos of their children on line.

INVASIONS OF PRIVACY

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

ven with the right settings in lace, absolutely nothing online is 100% private. Anyone who can view your photos could take screenshots and potentially share them elsewhere. Privacy settings are still important, though, so it's always wise to ensure your social media accounts have them set up; just bear in mind that you can't completely control what happens to thing once it's gone online.

REVEALING PERSONAL 0 DETAILS

nall details in photos can often reveal personal information. Backgrounds can give clues to where you live, for example, while school logos on uniforms, sports kits, or bags could help someone identify which school your child attends. With interactive maps and reverse image searches commonplace online, information like this could easily be misused by an individual with malicious intentions.

MISUSE OF IMAGES

nce something's been shared , it's almost impossible to get it deleted. Photos can show in search engine results and e downloaded, manipulated, and hared without consent. There's the otential for someone's images to be used for advertising purposes (which in many cases, isn't illegal) or even more inappropriate reasons, such as yber-bullying or serious forms of ploitation.



arm an online predator with the kind of information they can deploy to gain a child's trust. They might use this knowledge to pretend to be the same age as the child or to have a shared hobby. Essentially, the more a predator knows about a young

PRESSURE TO PLEASE

When their parents or carers share notable moments and accomplishments in a child's

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accompliaments in a child's life on social media, some children may begin to feel an expectation to always meet certain standards, to achieve things, or to behave in ways that are "worth obacies" Kanwing that ather meene sharing". Knowing that other people (even friends and family) can see these posts on social media might also add to the pressure they're feeling internally.

IMPACT ON DIGITAL FOOTPRINT

Every photo of a child posted online contributes to their digital footprint Young people's lives have never been so closely and publicity documented as they are now, and this permanent online presence could affect a child's future opportunities or the choices they make as they grow up – in addition to influencing how they see themselves and, consequently, their emotional wellbeing.

Advice for Parents & Carers

REVIEW SETTINGS REGULARLY

CONSIDER OTHER CHILDREN

When taking a group photo, make sure you get parents carers' permission to share it on social media. There m an important safeguarding reason for them not wantin ohoto posted publicly online, or it might simply not tall-bersonal beliefs or cultural background. A quick conve advance, just to make sure, is usually hugely apprecia
