Children in Y<sub>3</sub>/<sub>4</sub> consolidated their learning about Anglo-Saxons by visiting our local All Saint's Church this week to learn about and explore some 9th and 10th century Anglo-Saxon stones that were found in the grounds of the church that archaeologists believe were part of preaching crosses used in Anglo-Saxon times. We also learnt that there was a stonemasons' school in nearby Brompton! Wow! Children concentrated on sketching the crosses and asked lots of interesting questions. A huge thank you to Peter Harbord from the church and to John Parkinson from the Local History Society for helping us today.

# It's Time to Celebrate! World Book Day Is Coming!


